Travelling by train/bus/plane

There are many public transport options including rail service to Ararat operated by Public Transport Victoria as well as Stawell and Horsham, connecting to Melbourne and Adelaide operated by Journey Beyond (The Overland). V/Line operate a coach service from Melbourne to Halls Gap via Ballarat,

Ararat and Stawell, as well as from Melbourne to Mt Gambier via Dunkeld, Hamilton and Coleraine. Both coach and tour operators can connect you to the region's attractions. GRAMPIANS (GARIWERD) NATIONAL PARK



Welcome to Grampians National Park in Gariwerd Country. Renowned for rugged mountain ranges, rich cultural heritage and breathtaking views, the Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park is one of Victoria's most popular destinations.

Gariwerd is the traditional language name for the Grampians. Gariwerd Country is a spiritual place and it is paramount to the cultural values and heritage of many Traditional Owner communities in south-western Victoria. For over 22,000 years, Gariwerd has been the living, hunting, gathering, cultivating, ceremonial, Dreaming Country and territory of Jadawadjali and Djab Wurrung peoples and their ancestors.

The Gariwerd landscape is rich in Aboriginal rock art shelters, and the area contains over 80% of Victoria's rock art sites (some dating back over 20,000 years). There are currently five sites open for public viewing: Billimina, Manja, Ngamadjidj, Gulgurn Manja and Bunjil.

When it comes to walks and hikes, there are many to choose from, taking you to spectacular waterfalls, lookouts, rock formations and escarpments. Step out and explore the Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park's spectacular natural beauty on foot. There are many walks and hikes on offer, from a gentle stroll to a full day adventure or the multi-day Grampians Peaks Trail. For shorter walks that are suitable for any age or fitness level try the Venus Baths Loop Walk or the Balconies Walk, both walks are easily accessible, flat and less than 2 kilometres long. KEY SITES IN THE GARIWERD CULTURAL LANDSCAPE



NGAMADJIDJ SHELTER



Ngamadjidj Shelter is referred to as the “Cave of Ghosts”, this is due to the white painted figures that are illustrated across this site.

These paintings were applied with a stick or with fingers and were likely made with Kaolin clay that was ground and mixed with water.

BUNJIL SHELTER



This shelter is home to the only known rock art painting of Bunjil. According to the creation stories of the Traditional

Owners, Bunjil created all that the people saw – the land, water, trees, plants and animals. Bunjil set the laws and religion and remains here as a protector of the natural world, his people, their laws and beliefs. This shelter is considered one of the most significant cultural sites in south-eastern Australia.

BILLIMINA SHELTER



Jadawadjali people camped at Billimina shelter from late winter to early summer and left many red paintings.

You will notice the numerous bars arranged in horizontal rows, it is believed these marks were used to keep count of events, but it is also

hypothesised that the Jadawadjali people used these to record how long they spent at the shelter. There are also 55 human stick figures, as well as emu and kangaroo tracks displayed here. Findings from an archaeologists’ excavation in 1976 demonstrated that the Jadawadjali people used this place to shelter from harsh winters and caught small mammals such as bandicoots, possums and bettongs.

MANJA SHELTER



Manja (pronounced Manya), meaning ‘hands’, is situated in a sandstone outcrop. It has a total of 90 recorded

hand stencils across the two shelters. It is believed these stencils were used to renew the ties a person has to a particular place, as well as to record a visit to a site. You will notice animal tracks and human stick figures are also present at this site.

GULGURN MANJA SHELTER



Meaning “Hands of Young People”, the paintings at Gulgurn Manja include bars, emu tracks and

handprints. Many here were done by children, hence the name for the site. Some of the paintings here are found only in the northern sections of Gariwerd, some of which were part of a unique local art style which was used to pass on the law of the people and tell stories. You will notice sections within these walls where stone has been broken, the Jadawadjali people did this to make stone tools.

■ THE PINNACLE

The iconic Pinnacle walk and lookout is one of the highlights of the entire Grampians region. Hikers are rewarded with stunning views of Halls Gap and the Grampians' many peaks.

There are three walking options to reach The Pinnacle varying in distance and difficulty.

■ BORONIA PEAK TRAIL

Boronia Peak involves a rocky climb up to the summit which rewards you with superb views towards Lake Fyans in the east and over the Fyans Valley. The entire trail is complete with epic views as you wind your way to the peak. From the trail you can take another path that leads you to Brambuk Aboriginal Cultural Centre to experience Australia's native flora and fauna and Aboriginal culture.

■ VENUS BATHS

An easy stroll starting in the centre of Halls Gap follow the 2.3km track and cross over Stony Creek at the small bridge to the Botanic gardens. Take water and snacks and enjoy the peace and quiet. A walking track follows the river up to several deeper rock pools. The track is flat with no obstacles and makes for an enjoyable walk and great scenery for all ages.

■ WUDJUB GUYUN (HOLLOW MOUNTAIN)

Wudjub Guyun (Hollow Mountain) walk is suitable for fit and energetic walkers and can involve slippery track surfaces, rock hopping and rock scrambling. From the car park, follow the sign-posted gravel track as it climbs gradually through a wide open gully surrounded by rocky cliffs. Once on rock, the track climbs steeply over rocky ledges and past wind scoured caverns to a rocky summit which offers views over Mt Stapylton Amphitheatre and the Wimmera Plains. Return by the same route.

■ MUD-DADJUG (MOUNT ABRUPT)

Mud-Dadjug (Mount Abrupt) is a steep track that winds its way through Grampians bushland and up sandstone rocks to the summit. Once at the summit, take in the wonderful views of the Serra Range to the north and over Dunkeld in the south. Keep an eye open for wedge-tailed eagles, nankeen kestrels and peregrine falcons. For the best walking experience explore Mud-Dadjug (Mount Abrupt) in Spring to early Summer.

■ DUWUL (MOUNT WILLIAM)

At 1,167 metres, Duwul (Mount William) is the highest point in the Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park and provides great 360-degree views of mountain ranges and open plains. From the Mount William carpark it takes a moderately fit person approximately 45 mins to walk to the summit. Despite the steep walk the great views make it a must see for anyone wanting to see the entire Grampians from one lookout.

■ WURGARRI (MOUNT STURGEON)

Wurgarri (Mount Sturgeon) walk is suitable for fit and adventurous walkers, it involves water crossings, slippery track surfaces and rock hopping.

The summit offers panoramic views of the surrounding ranges and volcanic plains, and over Dunkeld. Return walk from the Dunkeld town centre or as a circuit from the Mt Sturgeon Carpark.

■ THE BALCONIES

From the same car park as Reed Lookout, you can walk the relatively easy two kilometres to the Balconies for panoramic views of Victoria Valley and the surrounding ranges. The unusual rock formation that sticks out of the mountain makes this spot particularly unique. The Balconies Lookout is a great spot for fresh misty mornings and sunset views.

■ BAINGGUG (THE PICCANINNY)

The view from the summit of the Bainggug (The Piccaninny) walk provides excellent views of Mud-Dadjug (Mount Abrupt) and the nearby town of Dunkeld with its impressive and unique landscape. Take the gradually climbing track through open forest that provides stunning wildflower displays during spring.

■ TUNNEL TRACK FROM POMONAL

From the Tunnel Road Carpark the track begins its steady climb past rocky outcrops to the top of the range. Descending the other side, you gain magnificent views of the Serra Range. This walk finishes at the Western Tunnel entrance. Return by the same route.

BE SAFE, BE PREPARED



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FOR MORE INFO

- Walking tracks may involve rock steps, uneven and slippery surfaces.
- Wear sturdy footwear with a good tread, keep to the track and away from cliff edges.
- Carry a quality map, plan your timing and return from walking well before dusk.
- At lookouts never climb behind barriers, they are there for your safety.
- Carry plenty of water and wear protective clothing for the season and conditions.
- Dogs, other pets and drones are prohibited in National Parks
- Please take your rubbish home with you

GRAMPIANS PEAKS TRAIL



The **Grampians Peaks Trail** connects some of the Grampians' most spectacular peaks, from the massive sandstone outcrops around Mount Stapylton in the north to Mud-Dadjug (Mount Abrupt) in the south. It can be done as the full 160km 13 day/12 night hike, or in shorter sections with more than 20 different trail options on offer.

Regardless of the itinerary selected, the trail provides walkers an experience rich in the Aboriginal culture of the Jardwadjali and Djab Wurrung peoples, who have lived in these ranges they call Gariwerd for thousands of years. Interpretation signage along the trail helps hikers learn more about the area's Aboriginal cultural heritage and provides information about the national park's incredible environmental values.

There are 11 bookable hike-in campgrounds with camper numbers capped at between 20 to 35 depending on the location and to ensure a special experience. Two of the hike-in campgrounds, Gar and Werdug, feature three small Hiker Hut accommodation options, to support walkers looking for more comfort. These huts are only bookable by Licensed Tour Operators.

Wide-open spaces, dramatic landscapes and endless opportunities await you as you road trip around the spectacular southern extremity of the Great Dividing Range.



NORTHERN ROUTE



ARARAT

Located at the foothills of the Grampians and surrounded by picturesque pastures and undulating countryside, **Ararat** is the centrepiece of a rich wine growing region, boasting the largest number of wineries of the four Grampians regions. Spend an afternoon sampling award-winning drops at local cellar doors, or experience an abundance of diverse cultural and historical attractions, including the **Gum San Chinese Heritage Museum** and the chilling **J-Ward Gaol** and **Aradale Asylum**. To see the region from another angle, drive, walk or cycle to the top of **One Tree Hill** for 360-degree vistas of the district – this spot has one of the best views in town.

POMONAL

Stop to smell the wildflowers at **Pomonal**, a picturesque village set against

the dramatic backdrop of the **Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park**.

Only a 10-minute drive from Halls Gap, this town is famous for its native flowers and orchids. The area's rolling green hills provide the perfect bucolic backdrop for nature walks, vineyard visits and farm gate trips.

LAKE BOLAC

50 kilometres south of Ararat, **Lake Bolac** is within easy driving distance to both the **Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park** and the Great Ocean Road. An important commercial hub for the surrounding farms, the township is also a destination in its own right. As a popular spot for boating, fishing and sailing, Lake Bolac is a top destination to switch off and enjoy a relaxing break surrounded by nature.

ARADALE

It closed in 1993, but its 126 year history saw many changes in the treatment of the mentally ill. Walking tours will take you into places such as the chapel, through the many wards, the huge kitchen, the administration building and of course, the morgue.

J WARD



A visit will bring to life the intriguing history of the site; firstly as the Ararat County Gaol and secondly as a ward of the Ararat Lunatic Asylum. It started out as a gaol during the gold rush in the 1800s, and it was taken over by the Lunacy department in 1887, until its closure in 1991.

The best way to see and understand J Ward is to join one of the regularly conducted guided tours. Bookings are essential and can be made online.





HALLS GAP

Sitting at the base of the **Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park, Halls Gap** has a stack of accommodation options, eateries and activities right on your doorstep. The area is renowned for its incredible hiking tracks and abundance of native wildlife including kangaroos, emus and wallabies. The hike to **The Pinnacle** offers blockbuster panoramic views of the surrounding mountains, valleys and lakes – don't miss it. If you prefer to canoe, fish or birdwatch, **Lakes Bellfield, Lonsdale, Fyans and Wartook** are all within a short drive. Feeling more adventurous? Rock-climbing, abseiling, canoeing and 4 x 4 driving adventures are all on offer within striking distance of Halls Gap.

STAWELL

A 20-minute drive from Halls Gap, the historic gold mining town of **Stawell** is the closest major commercial centre to the **Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park**. See the track where the prestigious **Stawell Gift** takes place each year at Central Park, then check out the **Stawell Gift Hall of Fame** to see memorabilia and learn more about the race's long, proud association with Stawell. Nearby, **Black Range State Park** is well worth a visit. Be sure to take the walk to **Bunjils Shelter** – a huge rock overhang with ancient rock art depicting Bunjil, an Aboriginal spirit figure.


GREAT WESTERN

Great Western is a quaint and charming township located on the Western Highway



between Ararat and Stawell. Settled in the 1840s by sheep graziers, Great Western rapidly developed through the discovery of gold and then the planting of grape vines. Today, Great Western's wineries have achieved global fame and accolades for producing top quality wines. Don't miss the underground cellar tour at **Seppelt!**





Full of hidden treasures, **St Arnaud** is one of the best examples of a complete, gold heritage town in the Grampians region and is well worth lingering in for a while.



Pull up a stool at one of the lively historic pubs, then work off your pub meal with a wander amongst Australia's largest township collection of **Silo and Street Mural Art**.

See Victoria's oldest fire station and the heritage listed **St Arnaud Railway Station**. Take a stroll through the manicured gardens of **Pioneer Park** (the only known public garden designed by revered landscape designer, Edna Walling) and the **Queen Mary Gardens**, and admire the town's cast-iron lace work verandas. Spot native wildlife, venture down to the **Teddington Reservoir** to camp out or fish in the nearby lakes and rivers.

A 30-minute drive to the **Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park**, Horsham is the capital of the Wimmera. An ideal base to uncover the region's delights, choose to dine at cafés and restaurants, go on a shopping adventure or view public art located throughout the central business district. Visit the **Horsham Town Hall and Regional Art Gallery** for live performances and exhibitions. Stroll along the **Wimmera River**, lined by ancient red gums; or tee off at **Horsham Golf Club** – considered one of the top regional public access golf courses in Australia. If fishing is more your style, then drop a line at **Taylor's Lake, Green Lake** or the **Wimmera River**.

Horsham's **Silo Art site** celebrates the significant story of Yanggendinyanyuk, a Wotjobaluk warrior's story. The life of Yanggendinyanyuk (His Walking Feet) is embedded throughout Wotjobaluk Country.

WARTOOK VALLEY

Located on 'the sunset side' of the Grampians (Gariwerd) and only a 30-minute drive from Horsham, **Wartook Valley** is home to spectacular sunsets, brilliant night skies, rugged mountain views, scenic walks, abundant wildlife, Aboriginal rock art and spring wildflowers. Hike the picturesque peaks of **Mount Zero** (Mura Mura), walk the **Zumsteins track** to the beautiful **Mikunung wira (MacKenzie Falls)**, visit the oldest olive groves in Australia, go horse riding, or fish for trout and redfin at **Lake Wartook, Lake Toolondo** and **Rocklands Reservoir** near the **Black Range State Park**.

DADSWELL'S BRIDGE

Home to the **Giant Koala**, this small town with a mountainous backdrop offers

FRAMING THE WIMMERA

Framing the Wimmera project is based on taking pictures of our landscape, positioning the lens to frame an image, capturing the essence of the moment or the beauty of the environment.

Nati Frinj festival founder and local artist Dr. Greg Pritchard installed a large wooden frame outside Natimuk that framed Mt Arapiles. For over several years, it captured people's photographic attention and connected them to this iconic vista of the Wimmera. *The Age* journalist Kim Smee described the frame as "the most beautiful work of art I've ever seen".

Inspired by the success of this installation, Horsham Rural City Council Public Art Committee commissioned four permanent structural frames to frame outstanding views of the municipality.



1. **Arapiles View** – Natimuk
2. **Grampians View** – Brimpaen/Laharum Road
3. **Wimmera River View** – Three Bridges Road
4. **Toolondo Reservoir View**

HORSHAM SILO ART

Horsham's first silo art mural features a story of reconciliation, resilience and great legacy.

Horsham, the capital of the Wimmera, is the gateway to the Silo Art Trail, Australia's largest outdoor gallery. The trail stretches over 600 kilometres, linking Horsham with neighbouring towns by providing an insight into the true spirit of the Wimmera Mallee.

Horsham Silo Art's newest site celebrates the little known but locally significant story of Yanggendinyanyuk, a Wotjobaluk warrior's story of leadership, resilience and great legacy.

Situated in the Heart of Horsham, Yangga Dyata (which means "Walking on Country") emerges. This silo art mural celebrates the story of Yanggendinyanyuk (meaning "walking feet"), who was born in 1934 in Wotjobaluk Country in the Wimmera Region of North-Western Victoria.

He was praised for his role in finding the Cooper-Duff children in the "Lost in the Bush"



story and for his part in the first Indigenous cricket tour to England. Tied together with the adjacent flour mill image of Yanggendinyanyuk's totem the Black cockatoo, the images portray the strong linkage to country that the region has.

HORSHAM FAMILY FUN ACTIVITIES



NATURE AND WATER PLAY PARK

Located at Horsham's riverfront precinct near the rowing club, the park will be free and accessible for all ages and capabilities, all year round.

Due for completion early 2023, the Nature and Water Play Park will include a gently flowing water course, manually operated hand pumps, systems of adjustable dams and weirs, spray heads and pop jets — suited to operation by children of all ages. There will also be play elements that can be used all year without water flow, including small boulders for climbing, logs for balancing, stones for jumping along and sand pits. The Wimmera River's natural beauty will be retained and the Nature and Water Play park will reflect this.

WATER RECREATION

The Wimmera region provides great opportunities for fishing, boating, water skiing, windsurfing, kayaking and paddle boarding. Green Lake, located south of Horsham, with a sandy shore has a picnic area overlooking the beautiful lake and includes a boat ramp, jetty and swimming beach. Taylors Lake, a few kilometres north of Green Lake, is a recreational lake suitable for all water sports. One of the favourite places for all ages is the Wimmera River that flows directly through Horsham.

WEIR PARK

Located at the start of some beautiful walking tracks and boardwalks through to the wetlands with a 1.2 km walk called the Yanga Track, Weir Park is a popular spot for family gatherings with undercover BBQ and picnic facilities, playground and toilets as well as an off-leash dog park.

ANZAC CENTENARY WALK BRIDGE AND PUMP TRACK

Anzac Centenary Walk Bridge crosses from the north side to the south side of the Wimmera River. The suspension bridge creates an additional opportunity linking walking tracks. Apex Island is also known as Adventure Island Playground and it offers a giant slide and unique playground equipment, such as the new Pump Track which is a circuit of banked turns and humps, suitable for bikes, scooters and trikes.

Halls Gap Zoo is Victoria’s largest regional zoo, featuring over 160 species of native and exotic mammals, reptiles and birds.

A visit to Halls Gap Zoo is bound to delight kids of all ages. You can even have a close encounter with one of the zoo’s main attractions! From curious red pandas, cheeky meerkats and lazy lizards to a graceful giraffe or even a rumbling rhino! This is an experience you and your family will never forget.

Why not try the Lakeview loop, Venus Baths or The Balconies Lookout? Each one is graded easy and will take around 30 minutes.

GREAT LAKES OF THE GRAMPPIANS

Lake Wartook

Stay cool this summer by skipping the beach and heading inland to the beautiful Grampians. The region offers many opportunities to stay cool in the summer with its refreshing lakes and shaded waterways.

Surrounded by stunning scenery the warmer months are the perfect time to cool down and relax in the glistening waters of the Grampians. Take in the panoramic views of the breathtaking mountains and reflective waters at **Lake Bellfield** just 5km from the main shops in Halls Gap. Enjoy the refreshing water with a swim or from a canoe or kayak, or simply relish the lake's beauty from the shore by having a picnic.

Lake Wartook is a fantastic spot for fly and shore fishing (swimming not permitted). Only 4km from Ararat, **Green Hill Lake** is the perfect spot for affordable getaways with free camping, trout galore for keen anglers, and walking and cycling tracks that run all the way into town. For boating trips, **Lake Fyans** is the go-to destination for fishing redfin and trout or for simply gliding across the water and enjoying the soothing sights and sounds of the bushland.

Lakes Fyans, Bellfield, Wartook and Toolondo have developed into nationally renowned trout waters which, combined with stocking of native species Golden Perch and Murray Cod into **Rocklands Reservoir** and **Taylor's Lake**, make the Grampians region a freshwater sportfish haven.

Seasonal yabby catches, native blackfish and the ever-reliable English Perch (redfin) add to the variety of species available, giving anglers of all types and experience levels the chance of an epic catch from the shore or boats and kayaks.

Ideal baits include worms, yabbies, mudeyes and Powerbait, as well as casting soft plastic and hardbody lures. Top tips include trolling winged lures from a kayak or small tinnie among the standing timber and reed beds for that trophy trout in Lake Fyans, with larger deep diving hardbody lures in dark colours

the better choice for landing a legendary Murray Cod in Taylors Lake. Spectacular Lake Wartook has been the traditional home of fly fishing for decades and can produce the brown trout of a lifetime. A simple bladed spinner cast and retrieved around the reeds or off the Lake Fyans wall is a sure fire method to land a redfin or two and great for kids to try their luck.

A Recreational Fishing Licence (RFL) is required for anglers between the ages of 18 and 70 and covers all forms of recreational fishing in all of Victoria's marine, estuarine and inland waters.

HENTY WINE REGION

The Henty wine region, one of the coolest of Australia's mainland wine growing regions, stretches from Western Victoria to Southern South Australia.

The region is known for its aromatic white wines, luscious sweet dessert wines and intense, finely structured reds. The wine grape varieties which have been most widely planted in the Henty region are Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Sauvignon Blanc, Riesling, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. Also to be found are Semillon, Shiraz, Pinot Meunier and Pinot Gris.

GRAMPIANS WINE REGION

The Grampians wine region is home to some of the world's oldest vines. Known for dense, purple and peppery Shiraz and sparkling wines, the Grampians has been a quality wine-producing region for more than 150 years.

As you explore the undulating hills from Buangor to Halls Gap, there is plenty to discover with an abundance of wine-related experiences.

According to wine critic Max Allen, the Grampians wine region in western Victoria produces some of the best shiraz in Australia.

Discover the eclectic mix of mediums and subjects at **Ros McArthur's studio** in the picturesque Mirranatwa and in Halls Gap, acclaimed environmental artist Steve Morvell showcases work dedicated to raising human awareness of the beauty and fragility of wildlife and the habitats in which we co-exist.

The **Horsham Regional Art Gallery**, **Hamilton Gallery** and the **Ararat Gallery TAMA**

each offer unique permanent collections, visiting exhibitions along with workshops and classes. As you journey through the region, you will discover the many towns and villages that offer an array of community arts to explore.

If you want to enjoy the rare opportunity of seeing glassblowing in action visit James McMurtrie in his Pomonal studio. James' artworks are inspired by the Grampians mountains that surround his studio.

With 25 years of experience using traditional techniques and tools, James skilfully creates high quality, functional and sculptural glass.

The Grampians is home to a rich tapestry of history and culture. Take time to visit **Gum San Chinese Heritage Centre** in Ararat and marvel the collection of Chinese textiles, embroideries and relics that tell the story of miners during the Victorian goldrush era.


Visit the **Volcanoes Discovery Centre** in Peshurst at the foot of the dormant Mt Rouse volcano, and be transported back thousands of years to when volcanoes were erupting right across the Western District and into South Australia. At the Centre you will see how the surrounding volcanoes formed and shaped the landscape.

Make time to visit some of the museums in the area including the **Sir Reginald Ansett Transport Museum**. The museum is dedicated to transport and tourism pioneer Reg Ansett, who commenced his transport business in Hamilton in 1931. Based on the Ansett company's original aircraft hanger, which has been relocated to Hamilton, the museum displays a collection of over 1,000 objects from throughout the history of Ansett Airlines.

Continue your journey to Murtoa to visit **The Stick Shed** – a grain storage facility known as Murtoa No. 1 Grain Store. It was built during World War II and is the only remaining shed of this type in Australia.


